Lifescrpts provides a framework for GPs, practice nurses and staff in the general practice setting to bring lifestyle risk factors of smoking, nutrition, alcohol, physical activity and weight management to the fore in their engagement with patients.

Implementing Lifescrpts involves:

- Identifying lifestyle risk factors
- Discussing risk factors with patients
- Setting lifestyle change goals
- Providing written lifestyle prescriptions
- Organising ongoing review of lifestyle risk factors
- Referring patients to other services that support healthy lifestyle choices.

Lifescrpts resources will support general practice to identify and address lifestyle risk factors as a part of the around 45 year health check.
